Biographical History: The Ashokan Reservoir construction began in 1908 to provide drinking water for the residents of New York City, and was completed in 1915. It is said that 2,300 people were relocated, more than 500 buildings moved or demolished, and 2,600 graves were transferred to other cemeteries. Eleven hamlets were flooded or relocated: Ashton, Boiceville, Brodhead's Bridge, Brown's Station, Glenford, Olive, Olive Bridge, Olive City, Shokan, West Hurley, and West Shokan. A large workforce was required for such an endeavor and they were housed in segregated camps around the area.

Scope and Content: The Ashokan Reservoir Collection consists of photo albums, court testimony, loose photographs, postcards, maps, and annual reports.
